Blessedness

The Beatitudes (/biˈætɪtjudz/) are blessings recounted by Jesus in Matthew 5:3-10 within the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew. In the Latin Vulgate, each of these blessings begins with the word beātī, which translates to 'blessed' (plural adjective). The corresponding word in the original Greek is μακάριοι (makarioi), with the same meaning. Thus "Blessed are the poor in spirit" appears in Latin as beātī pauperēs spīritū. Subsequently, the word was anglicized to beatytudes in the Great Bible of 1540, [7] and has, over time, taken on a preferred spelling of beatitudes.
